  To require a methods course that will instruct students in the research and writing skills specific to the discipline of history. The course (HIST 20003) will ensure that students have cultivated these skills prior to enrolling in the capstone seminar (HIST 49903).

The curren program outcomes remain the same but will be strengthened by this new required course. The change is in part a response to our current assessment mechanism, which takes place primarily at the capstone level (HIST 49903), where we found that students did not have the requisite proficiency in historical thinking, analysis, research, and writing. The new course, HIST 20003, will better prepare students and we hope to see that change reflected in future assessments of the capstone course.

This course may not be repeated for credit.
