This adds an additional eight credit hours of design to the degree program by replacing two, one credit-hour classes with three credit-hour classes (net gain of four credit hours), and by acknowledging two courses that were previously required, but the credit hours were listed as “Related Requirement” and “Associated Requirement” respectively (a total of six credit hours), and not actively counted as part of the major.

1. What is the justification for the change(s) requested?

In the Fall Semester 2019 the Interior Design Program was moved from a different department into the Department of Graphic Design, creating the Department of Design. This concluded a multi-year effort. The first major curricular priority for the new department has been to create a new foundation to support all departmental offerings. The Department has designed new foundation courses to specifically fit our students' needs in preparation for the rigorous upper-division Interior Design classes.

The jump in credit hours is actually only four more than the previous degree plan. Two required courses were listed as "Related" and "Associated" requirements and not added to the 68 credit hours total. Therefore, the actual previous number of required credit hours in the major was 74, not 68.
