This revision is a result of an extensive 5-year study and plan by the Department of Theatre, whose goals were to update, enliven, and re-focus our curriculum to 21st century Theatre vocations in Design & Technology (as well as other updates in Acting and Musical Theatre).

 - This re-focused curriculum asks for more versatility, and somewhat less specialization, from our undergraduate THDT majors, and from our Theatre faculty specializing in these disciplines.
