For TCU-In programs and approved programs not utilizing a U.S. transcript, courses count as residency credit, in which case the course grades are computed in the official TCU GPA and students can elect to take individual courses P/NC following TCU policy.

Students must participate in a "TCU-In program" or under a TCU partnership agreement in order to earn any type of credit towards their TCU degree when studying at partner institutions or approved program. Students may not study independently with a TCU international partner institution or TCU partner provider (where a TCU partner agreement is in place) and earn transfer credit. Programs and institutions outside of the TCU partnerships and agreements are not supported by the Center for International Studies. Students wishing to request transfer credit from such international programs and institutions should visit with the Center for International Studies and with their academic advisor prior to participating to verify if program credits will transfer to TCU.
