Request for Changes

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- 1. What is the justification for the change(s) requested?
  - Many of our peer and aspirational universities, including Vanderbilt, Wake Forest, Tulane, UNT, UT, Syracuse, Rice, and Elon require just 120 hours.
  - This has been a discussion that reemerged last year, and before that in 2005, with widespread support, but never came to fruition.
  - The reason for the somewhat strange number of hours seems to be due to a requirement for PE classes many decades ago.
  - Given that 15 hours in generally considered a normal course load, we think that a student ought to be able to complete an undergraduate degree in 8 semesters of 15 hours each, totaling 120 hours.
  - Across the university, students often get in a tight spot and need to take an overage or transfer in hours to make up the extra four hours. This is a source of complaints from both students and parents to faculty, associate deans, and administrators.
  - This change seems unlikely to result in a reduction in tuition dollars because of the flat fee tuition scale TCU uses for students taking between 12 and 18 in a long semester.
  - It would likely create some relief in offering elective classes that just serve as hours for some students. This may help with budget issues across many colleges as faculty lines are frozen and adjunct budgets are tight.
  - We are still looking into any additional policies that may need to be changed at the same time (e.g., residency hours), but don't perceive other significant changes as a result and no negatives have emerged.
  - There are numerous degrees across the university, including in our colleges of fine arts and science and engineering, that require over the minimum to graduate, but those would remain unchanged if this policy were changed.
