 - a. TCU has assigned an administrator from its School of Interdisciplinary Studies (SIS) to inform the students about the closing of the Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages (TESOL) certificate. Four (4) TESOL certificate students were notified through advising about the closing of the program and identified the specific courses each student needed to complete to complete the program.
- 3. An explanation of how all affected students will be helped to complete their programs of study with minimal disruption.
 - a. That same administrator has formed a "teach out" plan, working with each affected student to complete their respective programs of study with minimal disruption. The required courses were scheduled for Spring 2021 semester and students were invited to enroll and complete their programs.
