In accordance with the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges' *Principles of Accreditation: Foundations for Quality Enhancement*, Texas Christian University (TCU) submits this teach-out plan for the **Political Science – International Relations**.

- 1. Closure date: May 1, 2022
- 2. How affected parties will be informed of the impending closure. All current majors will be notified via email that the major will not accept new students, but that they will be able to complete all required courses. All faculty who teach in the major were part of the decision to terminate it (all classes for the major also fulfill requirements for the 2 other Political Science majors).
- 3. How affected students will be helped to complete their programs of study with minimal disruption or additional costs. Students completing the major will proceed just as they had before. All required classes will continue to be offered.
- 4. Will students subject to the teach-out plan will incur additional charges or other expenses because of the teach-out and, if so, how the students will be notified. Students will not incur any additional costs due to the teach-out plan.
- 5. Copies of signed teach-out agreements with other institutions, if applicable. No teach out agreement is needed with any other institution.
