The BA with a major in political science requires 30 hours of political science courses passed with a grade of "C-" or better and a maximum of 13 hours below the 30000 level.

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Consistent with the traditional liberal arts, BA students are required to explore political science broadly. At the lower level, students will take introductory courses in three political science subfields (American Politics, Political Theory, Comparative Politics, International Politics, Judicial Politics, Methodology), while at the upper level, students are encouraged to explore a breadth of topics, though they will have the opportunity to concentrate their upper level classes in a particular subfield.

Students intending to do graduate work in international or comparative fields are encouraged to continue foreign language study beyond the 20000 level. A minor is required; any minor approved for the BA degree is acceptable.
