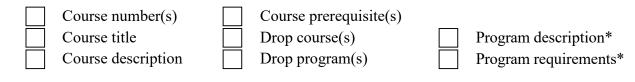

EC-6 and EC-6 Bilingual Program Changes

Briefly Summarize Changes:

- 1. Change EDEC 30001: Professional Practice Seminar from 1 to 3 hours. New course number EDEC 30003.
- 2. Change EDEC 41151: Senior Field Experience from 1 to 3 hours. New course number EDEC 41153.
- 3. Change EDEC 41102: Leaner-Centered Teaching: Assessment from 2 to 3 hours. Return to original course number EDEC 41103.
- 4. Remove EDEC 42213: Professional Induction: Teaching Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Exceptional Learners from Senior II block from Generalist EC-6 and Generalist EC-6 Bilingual Option.
- 5. Move EDUC 41113: Schools, Curriculum, and Society from Senior I block to Associated Requirements.
- 6. Change Associated Requirements from 12 to 15 hours.
- Change the bridge course EDUC 55313: Educational Assessment to EDUC 55133: Reading Instruction Grades 3-6 in the Generalist EC-6 Bilingual Option to mirror that of Generalist EC-6.

Justification for Changes:

- 1. Currently, students receive 1 credit hour for the certification examination preparation course EDEC 30001, yet it is the equivalent to a 3-credit hour course. This change will better reflect the time required of this course.
- 2. Currently, students receive 1 credit hour for the field experiences in area schools in EDEC 41151, yet it is the equivalent to a 3-credit hour course. This change will better reflect the time required of this course.
- 3. In Spring 2022, the COE changed this course from 3 to 2 credit hours as part of a credit hour reduction to the program. This change is no longer needed so we are returning to the original 3 hours of credit.
- 4. EDEC 42213: Professional Induction: Teaching Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Exceptional Learners content is embedded, in part, in other courses. The removal of this course aligns with the Middle, Secondary, and All-Level programs and addresses the need for credit hour reduction to the program.
- 5. Moving EDUC 41113: Schools, Curriculum, and Society to the Associated Requirements creates space for students to take this course outside of the Senior I block.
- 6. Moving EDUC 41113 to Associated Requirements requires the change from 12 to 15 hours.
- Changing the bridge course EDUC 55313: Educational Assessment to EDUC 55133: Reading Instruction Grades 3-6 in the Generalist EC-6 Bilingual Option to mirror that of Generalist EC-6.

Languages Other Than English (LOTE)

All individuals seeking Texas teaching certification with a major in Spanish, French, or German must take the Languages other than English (LOTE) state exam along with the EC-12PPR.

Education Major Transfer Work Credit

After enrolling at TCU:

- All education majors must receive prior written approval from their academic adviser and the associate dean before taking courses at another institution. Coursework taken without prior written approval may not be applied to a degree.
- No more than 12 total semester hours, except those earned in an approved study abroad program, may be transferred from other schools.
- No credit may be transferred from a community college once 54 cumulative semester hours have been earned.
- Transcripts of coursework taken elsewhere must reach the Office of the Registrar within 30 days of completion of the coursework.

College of Education Career Services Center

The Career Services Center maintains contact with public and private schools seeking teachers, school counselors, administrators and other types of educational personnel. Registration with the center entitles students to file a summary of their academic records together with requested recommendations from teachers and others acquainted with their qualifications. Former students may use the center in seeking positions. The center provides on-campus interviews with school districts in Texas, as well as outside the state. More than 75 school districts conduct interviews on campus each year.

Education Student Organizations

The College of Education sponsors student organizations for the purpose of promoting professional goals and interests, as well as providing recreation and fellowship among members. An international honor society in education, Kappa Delta Pi, invites to membership juniors, seniors, graduate students and classroom teachers who possess high scholarship ability. TCU's chapter of the Texas Student Education Association provides students with associate membership in the National Education Association and the Texas State Teachers Association (TSEA). TSEA provides students with the opportunity to meet and discuss professional concerns and goals with experienced teachers in the profession. The Council for Exceptional Children pre-professional organization is open to all students interested in special education.

Education Majors, Minors and Certifications

Early Childhood Education, BS

The early childhood major is designed for students who plan to teach in early childhood settings (EC through grade 6). Students focus on developmentally appropriate pedagogy for children. Field-based coursework provides prospective teachers with significant experiences in urban schools. Students interested in this major will have the option to obtaining certification in ESL and SPED.

Generalist EC-6 with Bilingual Option: This option is designed for students who will teach in bilingual (Spanish) early childhood settings. Students wishing to pursue this degree option must demonstrate proficiency in Spanish as a condition for admission to the College of Education. The Department of Spanish and Hispanic Studies conducts the Spanish Language Assessment. Students must pass required state examinations, including the Bilingual Target Language Proficiency Test (BTLPT).
