Briefly summarize the change requested: 3 changes are being proposed:

- Add 2 credit hours of Chamber Music, which brings the program in alignment with the BM String Instruments degree requirements.
- Remove the requirement for Modal Counterpoint (MUSI 30222), give students the option to take Modal Counterpoint or Counterpoint (MUSI 30232), and use those 2 credits to increase the elective requirements along with adding a brief list of suggested courses that will fulfill the requirement.
- Clean up the Ensemble requirements to be more specific and focused.

1. What is the justification for the change(s) requested?

The program faculty are attempting to make the performance degrees more relevant to our graduates as they enter the profession. These changes accomplish four goals:

- 1. They provide some additional flexibility for students in choosing which version of counterpoint they wish to take to satisfy the degree requirements in music theory.
- 2. Uses the 2 credits saved by removing the requirement for Modal Counterpoint for additional Music Electives with the ability for courses in the Arts Leadership and Entrepreneurship (ARLE) program to count as a music elective. These courses expose students to the world of music business and arts leadership, a critical base of knowledge that our students can benefit from and can lead to either a certificate or minor in Arts Leadership and Entrepreneurship.
- 3. Many students in the program have been missing Chamber Music, a critical piece of a well-rounded performance degree, for many years. When students are able to participate, they are forced to use electives to gain chamber music experience. The comparable String Instruments BM has had this requirement for many years and this change brings the very similar performance tracks into alignment.
- 4. The clean-up of the ensemble listing:
 - a. Makes it clearer, with course numbers and credit hours listed.
 - b. Removes Marching Band as an option to fulfill this requirement.
 - c. Removes the restriction of only allowing Jazz Ensemble to count for a maximum of 2 semesters, treating it equally as one of the School of Music's large ensembles.

The changes can also be considered to make the degree more relevant to our students while also better preparing them for a career in the arts.

2. If applicable, explain how the change(s) will affect the current program outcomes and assessment mechanisms.

Current program outcomes will be improved by giving students the option to take courses that expose them to critical music business concepts that could lead to increased and varied employment opportunities after graduation.

Assessment will be largely unaffected as neither the modal counterpoint class nor the ALRE course are currently assessed in the program reviews. Chamber music is also not currently a formal part of the assessment process for the degree program.

3. Faculty Resources: How will the unit provide faculty support for this change and any other impact this change may have on other current departmental listings.

We have consulted with the College of Fine Arts and they will be able to accommodate the additional students that will now be encouraged to take the ARLE course. The changes to the

counterpoint requirement and the addition of chamber music will not affect faculty resources.
