Recent assessment effort have identified areas where the department can improve our communication with students. The intent of our 40000 level classes is to serve as capstone courses for students at the end of their coursework. The current prerequisite listings make it appear that individual courses function as the prerequisite when the goal is to have the four course core requirements as a prerequisite. this catalog change clarifies the intent which will be beneficial to students in understanding their degree plan, advisors who are helping students plan their future enrollments, and our assessment efforts for the COMM-BS.

By clarifying course progress, we will be able to focus assessment efforts for both the core requirements as well as the 40000 level capstones. Assessment can examine outcomes more programmatically rather than granularly at the course level.
