<p>Chinese Minor Requirements</p> <p>The minor in Chinese requires a minimum of 18 credit hours, including at least four language courses and one Chinese-related content course. At least two 30000-level courses are required, one of which must be a language course.</p> <p>A maximum of 6 credit hours transferred from study abroad programs may count toward the minor.</p> <p>A maximum of 3 credit hours offered outside of the Chinese program may count toward the minor.</p> <p>Other courses may also be accounted toward the minor approval from the Chinese program coordinator.</p> <p>Native and heritage speakers of Chinese may not receive credit for the 10000- and 20000-level language courses. In order to earn the minor in Chinese, a native or heritage speaker must complete a minimum of 6 hours of Chinese language at the 30000 level or above. A native speaker is considered someone who completed his or her primary and secondary education in a Chinese-speaking country. A heritage speaker is someone who was primarily educated in U.S. schools but who speaks Chinese at home, with friends and co-workers, and is fluent. Any deviation from these regulations must be discussed with the Chinese program coordinator.</p> <p>French Minor</p> <p>The French minor requires a minimum of 18 semester hours, exclusive of courses on the 10000 level, and including at least one 40000-level course.</p> <p>German Minor</p>	<p><u>The MOLA minor requires 21 semester hours. Students may concentrate in Chinese, French, German, or Italian. The 21 semester hours can include:</u></p> <p><u>(a) 9-12 hours from the language-sequence courses (10153, 10163, 20053, 20063) in the relevant language;</u></p> <p><u>(b) and 9-12 hours from courses with the relevant language prefix (CHIN, FREN, GRMN, or ITAL) or the MOLA prefix, excluding the language-sequence courses. At least 6 of these latter 9-12 hours must be at the 30000 level or higher. No more than 3 hours from a course taught in English may be counted towards the MOLA minor.</u></p> <p><u>A maximum of 6 credit hours can be transferred from study abroad programs or other universities for the minor.</u></p> <p><u>No credit will be given to native speakers for 10000- and 20000-level language-sequence courses (10153, 10163, 20053, 20063); heritage speakers may only receive credit with permission of the program adviser and the department chair.</u></p> <p><u>A native speaker is considered to be someone who completed primary and secondary education in a country where the language of concentration is spoken. A heritage speaker is someone who was primarily educated in U.S. schools but who speaks the language of concentration in the home and with friends and co-workers. Native speakers and heritage speakers not eligible to take these courses must take additional upper-level courses instead of the language-sequence courses, to be determined in consultation with the program adviser.</u></p> <p>Chinese Minor Requirements</p> <p>The minor in Chinese requires a minimum of 18 credit hours, including at least four language courses and one Chinese-related content course. Italian Minor

A minimum of 18 semester hours in Italian, exclusive of courses on the 10000 level. No more than one Italian course taught in English may be counted toward the minor. A maximum of nine credit hours transferred from study abroad programs may be counted toward the minor.
