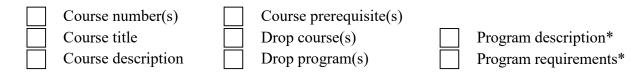

General Requirements To earn the BA with a major in writing, students must complete 33 hours in writing, creative writing, or English (exclusive of ENGL 10803 and ENGL 20803). Of these, at least 24 hours must be in upper-division CRWT, WRIT, or ENGL courses (30000 level and above). No more than 9 hours of lower-division credit may be applied to the major. All writing majors are required to take WRIT 38063 (Writing Major Seminar) after they have attained junior standing and completed 9 hours in WRIT or ENGL courses (exclusive of ENGL 10803, and ENGL 20803).	General Requirements To earn the BA with a major in writing and <u>rhetoric</u> , students must complete 33 hours in writing, creative writing, or English (exclusive of ENGL 10803 and ENGL 20803). Of these, at least 24 hours must be in upper-division CRWT, WRIT, or ENGL courses (30000 level and above). No more than 9 hours of lower-division credit may be applied to the major.
